Teach First NZ is a non-profit organisation building a movement towards **fair education for all**.

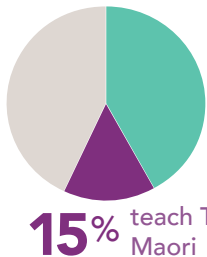
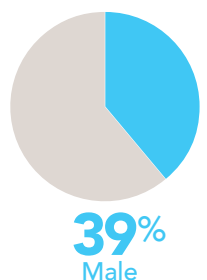
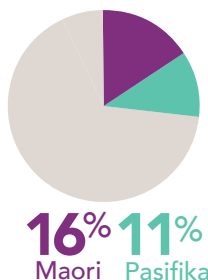
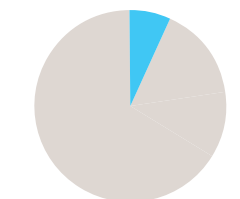
Our vision is that all young people in Aotearoa New Zealand achieve their full educational potential



We recruit **top talent** for lower decile schools.



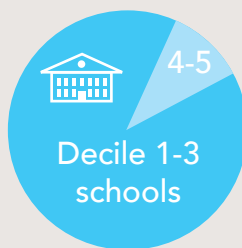

We strive to meet the demands of the communities that we serve.

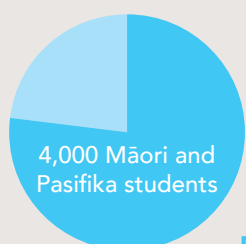
✓ **100%** of our participants **choose to teach** in schools serving low socio-economic communities
